His study on the Mass gathering of Sabarimala pilgrimage in Kerala was well-acclaimed and influenced policy decisions. He was also involved in a recently completed study on Vaccine hesitancy and the role of social media in the Malappuram district of Kerala, supported by the WHO. He published several papers on the recent COVID-19 pandemic in international journals. 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Prof. Venkatraman is in the area of HRD and Health Policy. He has several research publications, including a book on 'Public-Private Partnership in Health Care in India: Lessons for Developing Countries (Routledge, London). He has been a member of several high power committees, including Working group on PPP (11th Five Year Plan), National Technical Working Group (NTWG) on engaging Private Sector in TB control, US-India Health initiative, preparing a Model Concession Agreement for PPP in NCD Care for Niti Aayog, and task force on performance-based incentives for primary care providers by the Ministry of Health, GoI. He has delivered talks on knowledge platforms in several parts of the World.
